

A 3-day devotional about Jesus's crucifixion story Intended for ages 0-3, but can be modified for any age.

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### **Parents and Guardians:**

**Materials:** Crayons or markers. (optional: A small basin of water, towels to dry, small stool or chair)

**SAY:** Everyone that can hear my voice... count to three! ONE... TWO... THREE!




Fido knew in his little mouse heart that Jesus wouldn't be long. He just knew it! So that day, he went through the town cheering people


# He's Back!
